RUSK COUNTY Youth Project show



February 25 - 29, 2020

If you plan on showing steers, commercial heifers, lambs, goats or pigs at Rusk County Youth Project Show in February 2020 you need to validate/enter your project on the following dates:

Steer Validation -October 5th 8-10am Expo

Commercial Heifer Validation - October 14th—19th APPOINTMENT ONLY, Henderson Animal Care Hosp.

Lambs and Goats - December 7th 8-10 am Expo

Hogs and Breeding Gilts - December 7th 8-10 am Expo (Superintendent also needs to know if any PeeWee has their own hog in order to reserve a pen for that hog)

Breeding Heifers - December 7th 8-10 am (you only need to bring your entry cards and entry fee, not the animal)

Roasters - order forms are due November 15th, entry cards and entry fees are due at pick up on December 20th noon-1pm Wall of Brands Room at the Expo. Wingband numbers are due December 21st

Broilers - orders are due December 13th. Entry cards and entry fees are due at pick up on January 17th noon-1pm Wall of Brands Room. Wingband numbers are due January 18th

Shop and Creative Arts - January 9th 4-6 pm Wall of Brands Room at the Expo

Market and Breeding Rabbits - January 28th Henderson ISD Ag Facility

Breeding Goats - January 28th Henderson ISD Ag Facility (you only need to bring your entry cards and entry fee, not the animal)

Dairy Cattle - January 28thHenderson ISD Ag Facility (you only need to bring your entry card and entry fee, not your animal)

PeeWee - January 28th Henderson ISD Ag Facility (only bring entry card and entry fee, you do not have to bring your animal)

Texas has more than 550,000 youth who are involved in 4-H experiences each year and we are pleased that you have decided to join 4-H! Here is some information about our enrollment process and how we need your partnership in getting your membership entered and active. On August 13th all youth and adult memberships in Texas go to an inactive status. Adults and youth start to enroll on 4HConnect starting August 15th.

Youth Member Participation Fees

\$25.00 August 15 - October 31st \$30.00 November 1 to the completion of 4-H year

Adult Volunteer Application Fee

\$10.00 August 15 to the completion of 4-H year

Enrollment payment methods, procedures and additional fees may vary in each county, so check with your local county Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service office for more information (counties.agrilife.org). Each member must have an active profile to be considered a Texas 4-H member and participate in activities and events.

Texas 4HConnect Online is...

- a partnership between the 4-H family and the local county Extension Office.
- the official Texas 4-H Youth Development Program for enrolled adult and youth 4-H members.
- a secured database that is in compliance with the PCI Security Standards Council. Texas 4-H nor 4HConnect shares or sells any personal information to third party vendors without your knowledge or permission.
- based on "zero-based enrollment." This means that each year at the start of the enrollment cycle all membership in Texas 4-H goes to zero and everyone must re-enroll. This process is based on federal accounting policies.
- NOT a database for counties, clubs or families to enter family members that are not directly involved as a 4-H youth or adult member.

Did you know?

- Most questions can be answered by calling your local county extension office.
- You are not a youth or adult member of Texas
 4-H until you have an ACTIVE status listed on your member profile in 4HConnect.
- You cannot register for state or district level events in the 4HConnect until you are ACTIVE.
- Adult Volunteers are required to be screened through the Texas 4-H Youth Protection Standards program every three years. The screening process can take up to two weeks.
- A youth that is 8 years old and going into the 3rd grade must wait until September 1st to enroll for proper fees to be accessed in 4HConnect.

For those of you helping out that day please read the following:

- 1. If you have a 4-H T-shirt please wear it.
- 2. Saturday morning, November 9th meet at Boatcycle Chemical, 219 North Van Buren St., Henderson at 8:00 a.m.
- 3. You need to call and sign up for a shift of 1/2 day or all day. We have a schedule and we will fill the working spot on first come first serve. So call today and pick your time and spot to work.
- 4. We should have no more than 2 members per trailer. If you need somewhere to work, contact the Extension Office. We will have two pickup and drop off stops at each area. You can take money, stamp hands or help out in other ways. Just come ready to work!!! We always have a lot of fun and each club member can make money for their club by working.
- 5. Sign in!!! -- you must sign in and sign out in order to be counted. You must work all day (8 hours) or 1/2 day (4 hours) to be counted. There will be sign in sheets at the downtown loading and at the Depot loading.

!Attention Calf Scramblers!

Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo January 17—February 8

- •Purchase certificate value of \$500
- •Certificates used to purchase a breeding beef or dairy heifer
- 1. Entry applications will also be available on the Stock Show website *fwssr.com* on **October 1.**
- 2. Entries are sent directly to the show.
- 3. Entries accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
- 4. Each County 4-H Program is limited to a maximum of six entries.

Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo March 3—22

- •Purchase certificate value of \$1,500
- Certificates used to purchase a breeding beef or dairy heifer or market steer
- •Must show the animal in the 2018 Houston Livestock Show
- Online entry applications will be available on the Livestock Show website hlsr.com from October 1 through December 1.
- 2. Entries will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis

Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo March 14—28

- •Ultimate Scramble Championship
- •Purchase certificate value of at least \$1000 while others could be awarded \$1,500, \$2,000, \$2,500, or \$5,000
- Certificates used to purchase market or breeding animals.
- •Must show the animal in the 2018 Star of Texas Fair and Rodeo.
- •Entries begin **October 1** directly to the show.
- •Entry fee is \$25.


