





Rules:

- All participants must be 4-H members enrolled via 4-H Connect. At least 3 days prior
 to first event you must be registered on 4-H Connect and a member of the District 5
 Facebook group page so you will be able to post pictures.
- \$25 one time tournament entry fee. Participants may enter one or all events. There
 will be 3 events: June 1, June 8, and June 15.
- 3. An item of the day will be posted on Facebook before 5pm day 1.
- 4. Catch up to a daily bag limit of catfish during event hours and post them between 6pm day 1 and 6pm day 2. No more than 30 catfish will count.

Channel, Blue, their hybrids & subspecies.

Daily bag: 25 in any combination, Minimum length: 12 inches.

Flathead

Daily bag: 5, Minimum length: 18 inches.

- Minimum lengths will be used. Channels, blues, yellow/flatheads and hybrids will need to be measured on a Check-it Stik if they are smaller than 24 inches.
- 6. Big fish should be measured on a 6 ft. 2 x 4 or 2 x 6. Measure the fish on the 2 bye first and mark it with a pen or pencil, place fish next to the board, then use tape measure on the board. Item of the day should also be in the photo. Measurement must be readable in the photo.
- Those catching the most and largest legal catfish will win. Judges will have the final say
 on fish size for those that are not measured. Winners will be announced at the end of
 each event and then overall.
- Photo with Catfish and item of the day must be posted to the 4-H Fishing Facebook
 page during the event times. Posting before 6pm day 1 or after 6pm day 2 will not
 count. State laws must be followed.
- We encourage participants to fish with a buddy or as a club. Fishermen must be supervised at all times for safety reasons.
- 10. Medals/Rosettes awarded to 1st thru 5th place for each event.
