Hannah Jane Parrott represented the Rusk County 4-H program by competing in the 2019 Texas 4-H Roundup Share the Fun Prose Competition on June 12 during Texas 4-H Roundup in College Station.

In order to compete at state, Hannah, as a senior member 4-H'er, had to advance from district level to state level competition with her prose piece titled, "The Center Cannot Hold: My Journey through Madness."

On the morning of the competition, Hannah was the third contestant in the "Prose" competition, and she performed her piece on stage in the Rudder Forum on the campus of Texas A&M University around 9:30 a.m.

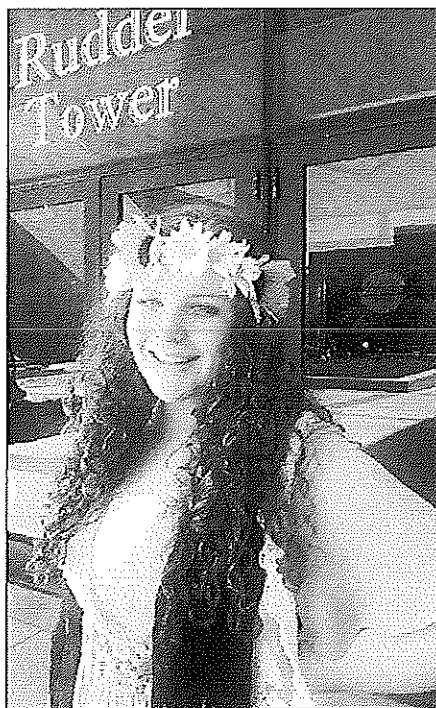
At 1 p.m., all contestants from every "Share the Fun" category reported to the Rudder Theater for the awards ceremony where the judges gave

constructive critiques for each and she represented Rusk County 4-H well with her spectacular performance.

Specifically for the Texas 4-H Share the Fun-Prose Division, the judges criteria included the following: material chosen for the performance; message-did it communicate a theme or idea; talent-the skills and ability of the 4-H'er to perform the presentation; presentation style-the method of acting; props and costuming; audience appeal.

Additional scoring was determined by the six minutes allowed for the performance and four minutes for set up and break down of props and equipment.

This was Hannah's first year as a senior 4-H member and her first trip to State 4-H Roundup,
